You may be happy to know that two of our students, Kumari SEETHALAKSHMI, D/o Mr. & Mrs. P. HARIHARAN and Master BALAMURUGESWARAN, S/o Mr. & Mrs. M.PARAMESHWARAN have secured the 10th rank in the State in the Class XII Examination held in March, 2002 and they are now eligible for scholarship to pursue their future studies. Our endeavours are being continued to improve the standards in all aspects. Parents of such students should see whether an easier system is better for their wards.

The advancement of science and technology has created a scenario where all these can be possible. Embedded systems are the basic concept involved in this. Embedded systems are basically smaller computers that run on a single chip collaborating nano-technology in it. 



# PRIZE WINNING ESSAY FROM SCHOLASTIC INDIA

[THE SCHOLASTIC INDIA PVT. LTD. conducted a national level essay writing competition for teachers on the topic "THE SCHOOL OF MY DREAM" One of our Teaching staff, Mrs.Omana Antony won a prize out of 680 entries from 237 schools. Congratulations!!]

## THE SCHOOL I DREAM OF ...

Only dreams can transform into thoughts which result in action.... here are my thoughts about an ideal school... a dream that can be materialised!!!!

School being the second home of the child, I really prefer it to be a homely one. All the members of a school, irrespective of the students, teachers, non-teaching staff and the management should have a familial rapport of mutual understanding, respect, trust and co-operation. Students must be able to experience the security, support, guidance, affection, freedom and friendliness as they are in their home because such a homely atmosphere is essential for the growth of a good citizen.

Whenever I think of an ideal school, my imagination flies on its wings to that age old Gurukula system. It is not the ideal premises of the Gurukula that lured me the most but its unique inner atmosphere. I said the inner atmosphere unique because there was not a speck of discrimination in the social, economical or racial status of the students. They were all in one status, that is, the status of a student in front of their Guru. And the Guru was the image of God to them, extending to the roles of teacher, parent, guide, friend etc moulding them into useful and successful human beings. The Guru imparts knowledge through his teachings, and practical wisdom through the various life situations to which his students are exposed to. Thus emerges a confident, skilful and determined generation capable of facing life with all its realities. The satisfaction the Guru achieves in fulfilling the perfect moulding of his disciples, and the gratitude of the students are truly divine since it is without a dot of hypocrisy.

My ideal Gurukulam has a few deviations from that of the traditional one. First of all, instead of the one-way teaching [Guru to student] I recommend the most essential criteria of quality education, ie a THREE-WAY interaction....Guru to student, student to Guru, and student to student. Here is the significance of the Residential schools. A child's school life should be confined to Residential schools. 5th to 17th years of a child's life is the most crucial period of his/her character and personality moulding...the physical, mental, intellectual and even spiritual growth of a child occurs during this period. There can be a lot of limitations, distractions and hinderances at home for the full-fledged development of a child. Hence let the 5th to 18th years of a child's life be that typical Gurukulavasam.

Every child is born with some characteristics. Neither the child nor the parents are aware of these hidden skills of the child. Exploration and excavation of these hidden mettle and through a self-awareness programme moulding the child to a confident and successful personality is the divine duty of a teacher. Hence a teacher is a divine smith with a noble purpose.

Teaching being a noble and dignified art, the one who enters to this field must be with a dedicated mind. A good teacher according to me is one who enjoys teaching, finds pleasure in interacting with students, has passion for the subject and capable of using a wide range of teaching methods to facilitate the learner's development, highly versatile and capable to tackle different and new situation, meet challenges effectively, has a mastery over the language and profound knowledge in the subject and above all has the perception to recognise the skills of the child and to equip them for the practical management. More over a child must be able to experience the affection, security, support, guidance and friendship in the company of a teacher who interacts with him/her. For this a teacher must have remarkable humility, patience and empathy. Such a teacher will never label any student; instead he/she will encourage and motivate to make positive differences in the life of the student. The very presence of that teacher will be an inspiration. Such good teachers are the pillars of my ideal school.

Unless the pillars are strong, the building will collapse; hence the teachers who form the pillars must be strong. It is the duty of the school management to energise the teachers. There should have a democratic and cordial atmosphere between the management and the teachers. Open-minded criticism, words of appreciation, freedom to express ideas, very lively and highly interactive meetings, incentives, family gatherings, enrichment programmes, personal criticism in private and keeping a perfect mutual understanding are the unique features of the management-teacher relationship of my ideal school. There shouldn't be anything that hinders the creativity of a teacher. A teacher must feel dignified of her/his status. Such a supportive and reliable management will be the foundation of my school.

Now since the home is ready what matters is the house. Of course it should be marvellous. The ideal location will be a calm, serene and vast area with natural beauty. The main building must be in a very attractive design with spacious, airy and bright classrooms with comfortable and convertible seating arrangement. Full-fledged and effective laboratories, libraries with effective reading room, recreational room, snack bar, sick room with medical aid, toilets and various activity [CC] rooms should be in separate blocks slightly away from the main building. This short distance walk will be a relaxation for the child and should be taken as an opportunity to discipline the child to reach on time. Hostel should be farther on the opposite side of the main building. A huge playground and excellent facilities for both indoor and outdoor games should be there. Space for gardening will be an additional attraction. Discipline, hygiene, food

and food habits, physical education and House competitions are areas that should be supervised thoroughly by the good teachers since those are the major areas of habits and character moulding. A serene hall for regular prayer and meditation is an integral part of my ideal school since prayer and meditation are the paths to self-awareness and to the development of a healthy mind. Each child must be exposed to every talent provided in the school till he/she finds out the hidden talents in him/her under the able and experienced hands.

Crime and punishment shouldn't be alien to this campus since the students are prepared to face realities. The best punishment should be the one that enables the child to realise the seriousness of his/her mistake. This sort of awareness is essential for self-discipline.

The younger generation that comes out from this ideal school will be self-reliant, Godfearing, ambitious, optimistic, indifferent to any sort of discrimination in status, and also with a sense of dignity of labour. How lucky a nation is to have such citizens to shoulder her responsibilities! How blessed and prestigious a school is that mould such a generation! THAT IS MY DREAM SCHOOL!!!



## THE COLOUR OF LIGHT

What is a rainbow? The "white" light that comes from the sun actually consists of seven different colours. # The man who enriched India's food bowl

M.S. Swaminathan, the noted agricultural scientist was honoured with the "World Food" prize in 1987 in Washington. By his devoted and patriotic effort, India has been able to shrug off her "Begging Bowl" image.

He was born in 1925 at Kumbakonam in Tamil Nadu. He was an ardent student from the very beginning and showed integrity in his work. He is an efficient organiser of projects. He has served the country by holding many significant positions. He worked within the country and abroad. He worked as the Director of the Punc Institute; as the Director General of Indian Agriculture Research Council; as the Secretary in Ministry of Agriculture and as the Vice Chairman of the Planning Commission.

Many Universities have conferred Doctorates on him. In 1972, he was awarded "Padma Bhushan" and won the Magsaysay Award. He was the first one to recognise the potential of the Marican wheat gene Norin through which India's lap filled with wheat. He also has a remarkable administrative personality. He foresaw the vital need for conservation of plant resources. He has been the tireless champion of sustainable agricultural and rural development. He set up an institute for agriculture with the prizes received from nations all over the world.

He has been honoured with Indira Gandhi Prize for Peace and Disarmament for his contribution to the Green Revolution, which ushered the era of socio- economic development in India. Dr. Swaminathan is now spearheading a movement towards what he calls the "Evergreen Revolution". He is the pride and glory of our country. Dr. Swaminathan heads "The centre for Research on Sustainable Agriculture and Rural Development" at Chennai.





#### From the Chairman's desk

Unless parents take an interest in these aspects as well, the school alone cannot do much. It is a wrong notion to feel that children interested in other than text books cannot perform well.

We have now special training in games thrice a week between 3.30 PM to 5 PM For those children interested, we will be organising "Clubs" in Creative English, Science, Mathematics and General Knowledge, two days a week between 3.30 PM and 5.00 PM from next term. You may encourage your child to select games and other activities of his/her interest.

## THE SCHOOL NEWS

#### (SENIOR SCHOOL)

Each child is unique and needs individual attention and facilities to develop skills and talents; and hence the various curricular and co-curricular activities. The Second Term though hectic with academics, was well balanced with various activities.

TESTS AND EXAMINATIONS: As usual the students had three tests per week from classes VI to IX and XI till 20th Nov. Then after a break the cycle of tests continued from 2nd December onwards. Classes X and XII had Revision Exams and are getting trained more and more through revisions, remedial teachings and written tests for the oncoming Public examination. The Half-yearly exam started on 9th Dec. for classes X, XI & XII with full syllabus.

EXTRA-COACHING: The School has arranged extra-coaching classes for the students who do not fare well in the tests and examinations. These classes are in the evenings from 3.45 to 5 by the concerned subject teachers. Study supervision classes are also there from 6 to 8 in the evenings on request of some of the parents for their wards.

Separate coaching classes have been arranged for class XII students according to their academic performance with an aim to push the capable ones to their best and all the others to their peak performance in the oncoming Examination. Apart from the routine classes, the coaching by the subject experts Mr. Suresh (Physics) and Mr. Joseph (Chemistry) from outside institutions goes on for the First group +2 students once in a week, as a continuation of the intensive vacation classes by the same people. Now we exhort the full support and cooperation of the parents to enable the students to reach their target.

ASSEMBLY: The Morning assembly continues to be an open arena for students to nurture their talents. Every Wednesday two students address the assembly gathering with a 3 to 5 minutes speech. On Thursdays, there is a 10-minute Presentation by a class on a particular lesson taught and trained by that subject teacher. On Fridays, two students present the News reading. The first 10-minutes of Sturdays, called as Zero period, is meant for the class teachers to interact with the students imparting some moral values. Monday mornings begin with the House Meetings. The brief meditation at the beginning and the end of the school hours is an effective act of disciplining.

LIBRARY: The students are well-trained and well-informed about the library ethics-how to do the reference work and, above all, they are given an open access to the books. Reading maketh a man......so goes the saying; but our Librarian, Ms.Renuka advocates the children to "Fall in love with books". Reading is a good habit and books are life-long friends, so we exhort the co-operation of the parents to inculcate this useful habit of reading in your wards. Encourage your children to read books of their interest at their leisure and also be aware of how often your child visits the school library and makes use of it. In order to avail the maximum benefit, the library is kept open till 5 o'clock in the evening.

CC CLASSES: The school provides training in various co-curricular activities like Vocal, Dance Mirudangam, Violin, Guitar, Yoga, Karate, Needle-work, Painting, Drawing etc., Some of our students performed excellently in competitions and have won State and National level prizes. All these CC activities are co-ordinated by Mr. Baskar, our Co-ordinator.

GAMES CLUB: Physical Education is an integral part of the curriculum; hence, apart from the routine PT classes, interested and talented students are trained in various games like Table Tennis, Foot-Ball, Cricket, Volley-ball, Basket-ball, Skating, Swimming, Yoga etc. These training classes are conducted three days a week from 3.45 to 5 in the evening.

LEO CLUB: Members of the Leo club are turning out to be luckier in inculcating the values of life, a vital ingredient of education. Under the efficient hands of Ms.Suriya Devi M.B., the Leo advisor of our school, the Leo members bestow their valuable service on the under-privileged and physically disabled children and old-age people every year at the time of auspicious occasions. The visits to the Deaf and Dumb school, Manamadurai; Old age Home, Pasumalai; the Polio Home, OCPM etc., and the meetings and sharings with those inmates were really a unique experience of love, charity and compassion for the Leo members. The co-operation and support rendered by the parents of these members is highly appreciable. It was with a devoted mind and divine pleasure that the Leo members collected usable clothes, toys etc. for the inmates. The donation of new sarees, dhothis and packets of biscuits by Sreemathy of class XC and 44 new bathing towels by Abilash of class XA were really inspiring acts of kindness.

TALENT-TIME: The last period of every Friday is used to nurture the talents of the students in Dramatics, Literary items, Quizzes and Fine Arts. Inter-house competitions are held in various areas. The winners will be honoured with certificates and books in the Third term.

GELS PROGRAMME: Our Vice-Principal, Mr. Velvendhan and the teaching-staff Mr. Mariyappan are the trained Course-instructors of GELS (Genius Education Learning Systems). They have started the international Abacus and Brain gym programme in our school. This programme uses traditional abacus methodology from China and the modern brain gym from the USA to develop the learning ability. With this skill the child has better memory, strong concentration and enhanced imagination. It makes learning a

fun activity and results in improved academic performance. This programme is meant for children of the age group between 7 and 13. There are altogether 8 levels; each Level with a duration of 3 months. The 1st batch of our school is going to complete the Second Level.

SEMINARS and COUNSELLING SESSIONS: Since we aim at the all round development of the personality of the child, the school takes all the care for a healthy growth of the child. Our Director, Mr. R. Gunaseelan used to conduct small seminars on Leadership training and Career formation for the higher secondary students. Resource persons from outside also used to be invited for these sort of seminars. Our teaching staff also attend enrichment programmes. The workshop on Story Telling conducted by Educational Resources and Information Centre (ERIC) was a good exposure to our English teachers. A few of our faculty members attended the workshop on learning disabilities organised by Resource Centre for Educational Counselling and Guidance of Madurai Institute of Social Sciences, Our Vice-Principal, Mr. Velvendhan conducted a small seminar to brief the teaching staff on learning disabilities (Dyslexia)

## PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

Knowing the child is the very step towards its education and that is the vital role played by the Purent Teacher Meetings. Our school provides access to any parent to any teacher at school during the working hours with a prior appointment. Lunch break and evenings 3.45 to 5 are also the announced timings for the parents. We had the Parent Teacher Meetings for all the classes in December except class X. We always welcome the creative and constructive suggestions from the parents for the welfare of the child. We expect full co-operation from the parents for an effective interaction with teachers.

They may notice their wards

- Spending so much time on dressing up / combing the hair
- Developing a reserved nature with parents.
- Developing an adamant and rude nature; and also liking to talk back/oppose.
- Trying to be alone in their dream world
- Indifference to any advice
- Interest to go out with friends.
- Disobedient and rude nature at home; but obedient and polite with others.

Any of these characteristics in the ward may disturb or upset his/her parent and will cause a lot of frustration, helplessness and depression. This strange experience is considered as the big problem / head ache by these parents.


How to overcome this stage? Nothing that serious / difficult; just understand that your child is undergoing a period of transition---- from boyhood to adulthood. And they have a lot of hazards, diversions, hinderances, confusions and difficulties to overcome to pass this stage successfully. They may not be knowing the consequences of what they do at this stage. Hence the parents must train themselves to be very alert, patient and open-minded. They must be patient to listen, open-minded to accept changes and understanding to help and support. Above all

- Parents must find adequate time to spend with their children.
- They must encourage their wards to express their views and should give due importance to them.
- Children must be brought up well aware of the living conditions of the family and the realities of life.
- Should not exaggerate the minor mistakes, at the same time matters of importance should be dealt with due seriousness.
- Home should be made into one which can attract all the members of the family through love, care and affection.
- Should have open and friendly chatting between parents and children.
- Assign them with some responsibilities. So that they'll be responsible.

Similarly a teenager should try to get rid of his/her prejudistic mentality towards their parents and elders. They must develop a friendly relationship with their parents. Above all, both the parents and their wards must have confidence and trust in each other. Then teenage will be the most beautiful age.







#### KARATE

Legend says that in 475AD a Buddhist priest Bodhidarma of South India traveled farther north crossing ne 'Y angize' river and met the Chinese Emperor 'WU' and he secluded himself in the temple Shorinj at lome province. Bodhidarma taught them a form of exercise, Yoga, the doctrine of Inseparability and the rorkouts practised by the Indian warriors, but the workouts were too strenuous for the Chinese monks, so odhidarma taught them easier movements with breathing techniques from Yoga, a system for developing ontrol of mind and body called 'Shorinji arts' (Chinese Fist). 'Shorinji art' was supreme in China and ourished for hundreds of years. Gradually the art of self-defence found its way to the East to the Pacific of Dkinawa.

The Okinawans had a fighting style of their own called 'tode'. When they learned Shorinji art, they ombined it with 'tode' techniques. The result was a new art called 'Okinawan-te'. ('te' means hand) It was racticed in secret for hundreds of years until 1901. Then it was brought to light as a part of regular urriculum in the first middle schools of Okinawa. Master Anhou Itosu was the first Instructor. It was rom his school that Master Gkhin Funakoshi acquired his training, and later in 1916, he introduced Karate o Japan. Master Funakoshi was pioneer of karate in Japan and he spent the rest of his life popularzing farate there. Later following his footsteps other Karate masters from Okinawa came to Japan. Rapidly, farate became wide spread and many Karate organization were formed. Rules for tournaments were ubsequently formulated to make Karate a competitive sport. Therefore it could be safe. Karate ha! its reginning in India, then in China, developed in Okinawa and systematized in Japan.

Master Glchin Feenakoshis fighting style called 'Karate' which means empty hand (Kara-empty, teiand). Master Feenakoshi died in 1957 at the age of 88. To him Karate was not only a great fighting system,
t was also a tool for building character. He wrote in his book "Karate; My way of life". As mirror's polished
urface reflect whatever stands before it, and a quiet valley carriers even small sounds, so must the students
of Karate render his mind empty of selfishness and wickedness in an effect to react appropriately towards
onything he might encounter.

Karate is now taught for self-defence in Dojos, Schools, and Police academies and on Army bases, nany Colleges and Universities teach it for credit in Physical Education. You can learn many different tyles of Karate. And you can do it whether you'r a male or female no matter how young or old.

Karate is an art concerned with character as well as self-defence. Karathekas are expected to show good sportsmanship and respect for their opponents. Concentration of power is called 'Kime' in Japanes, which means 'Focus' in English. The power must come from the center of the body and travel through arm or leg in to the hand or foot.

What makes Karate unique is the fact it is much more than a martial art. A student of Karate learns Philosophy, medicine, attack and self defence and above all, he learns how to avoid confrontations where he has to attack somebody or defend himself. He even learns to treat the injuries he causes to his opponent while attacking or defending himself. An advance student would learn about 'Marme' points or pressure points in the body. The points are used to cure various illnesses. The Chinese acupressure is also based on these pressure points. Karate is an all-round training of the body of the student to make him a complete man rather than just turnout savage warriors.


